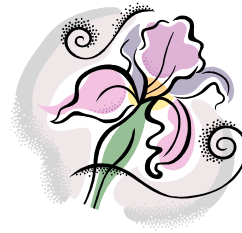

On Friday, you don't need any special golf expertise to enjoy the wine dinner at Flemmings. But there is a definite golf theme: Each of the five courses will be paired with wines from vineyards of three well-known golfers — Arnold Palmer, Greg Norman and Ernie Els. The selection, from the official wine list of the PGA, includes vintages from Australia, California and South Africa. Start off with stuffed heirloom tomatoes and a salmon and watercress salad. Main courses include lamb chops with a honey mustard glaze and stuffed flank steak. Finish with a dark chocolate bread pudding with maple syrup. Reservations required.

Run for the Roses

2 servings

3 ounces orange vodka
2 ounces peach brandy
2 ounces Southern Sweet
Iced Tea (recipe, below)
2 ounces fresh lime juice
Chambord for floating
2 rose petals for garnish
Ice

Combine vodka, peach brandy, iced tea, lime juice and ice in a cocktail shaker. Shake vigorously until the outside of the shaker is frosted and beaded with sweat. Strain into two rocks glasses filled with crushed ice; pour Chambord so that it floats on the top of the drink. Garnish drink with rose petals.

Chef and culinary educator Virginia Willis is familiar with this especially Southern combination—the perfect combination of salty and sweet. This recipe uses a cooked ham that is actually ready to eat without further cooking. One slight adjustment: Willis broiled the ham just before serving to give it a nice caramelized exterior.

Annie Belle Andrews' Coca-Cola Glazed Ham

10 to 12 servings

Hands on: 30 minutes **Total time:** 1 hour, 20 minutes

1 (5- to 6-pound) semi-boneless ready-to-eat half ham, preferably shank end
2 cups dark brown sugar, firmly packed
1 cup yellow mustard (or Dijon, as Willis prefers)
1 cup Coca-Cola Classic
Freshly ground black pepper

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a roasting pan with large sheets of aluminum foil in opposite directions to wrap the ham tightly for roasting. Set aside.

Using a chef's knife, score the ham in a crosshatch pattern. Combine the brown sugar and mustard in a small bowl to make a paste. Spoon the paste onto the ham to thoroughly coat, packing it in the crevices. Pour Coca-Cola over ham and season with freshly ground black pepper. Seal the ham in the aluminum foil. Transfer the ham to the oven and roast, basting occasionally, until the internal temperature reaches 140 degrees, about 10 minutes per pound, or 50 to 60 minutes.

Remove the ham from the oven and peel back the foil to expose the ham. Baste the ham with the pan juices. Heat the oven to broil. Return the ham to the oven and broil until dark brown and bubbly, 5 to 7 minutes, depending on the strength of your broiler. Transfer the ham to a cutting board to cool slightly. Thinly slice with a carving knife and serve the pan juices on the side.

The sculptures, from 7 to 25 feet long, include bees, spiders, dragonflies, ladybugs, grasshoppers, and praying mantises.
